

Pool Rules

Rules exist for the Safety & Enjoyment of ALL Residents.

Lifeguards have ABSOLUTE AUTHORITY at all times on all matters of Safety and Pool Rules.

If Security is called due to a violation of Pool Rules / Abusive Behavior, there will be a Loss of Pool Privileges.

- No Admittance (NO EXCEPTIONS) to residents without a valid HH Society Photo ID card displaying a 2019 sticker.
- No admittance is allowed if a lifeguard is not present.
- Residents are permitted 5 guests PER UNIT daily. (Guests under 2yrs are not counted).
- Residents must accompany, be responsible for & remain with their guests at all times.
- All children under the age of 16 must be accompanied at all times by an adult resident w/ a valid HH Photo ID & 2019 sticker.
- All Children ages 1 4 entering the pool must wear a US COAST GUARD Type II or Type III approved life jacket. Caregivers are required to provide the appropriate life jackets.
- Children in diapers must wear a waterproof diaper or swimmie.
- FOOD and SNACKS are PROHIBITED within the gated pool area. Picnic tables are provided for your convenience outside the gate.
- Lap Lanes are for the exclusive use of swimmers. 2 people per lane at a time. Limit is 30 min.
- Beverages (water only) must be in a NON GLASS container.
- Shoulder length or longer hair must be tied back or in a bathing cap.
- NO diving, jumping, running, Marco Polo or hanging on ropes.
- No abusive or rowdy behavior.
- Electronic / Audio devices need to be used courteously and quietly.
- Chairs, lounges & umbrellas may NOT BE RESERVED.
- The Safety Zone between the pool and the white line, including Pool steps/stairs, must remain clear of obstructions at all times.
- Pets are not permitted within the gated pool area.
- Smoking is prohibited inside the gated pool area.
 These NYS Sanitary Codes are mandated:
- All Persons must shower before entering the pool.
- Persons with communicable diseases, open sores/ bandages are prohibited from pool use.
- When there is thunder / lightning, EVERYONE MUST vacate the entire gated pool area at the direction of the lifeguard.
 - Pools may reopen 30 min after the last signs of thunder / lightning.

Pool # 1 open from 8 am to 10 am for lap swimming, From 10am until 8pm for all other swimming.

Tennis Reservations

7 Tennis Courts

Tennis Court reservations are made vis the hhsociety.org community website. All residents can reserve court times at no charge.

Select a date, make a reservation. Once you select a date, available time slots will be available. Select your **START TIME.** Once selected, scroll down and select your **end time** from the dropdown menu.

Reservations can only be made in increments of 30 minutes. Same day reservation cannot be made for any time slot that has already begun. Reservations for a time slot end 15 minutes before that time slot begins.

Reservations may not be made during prime time for instruction on courts 1 through 5 unless the Society Board approves it. Prime time is from 8 am to 11:30 am. **1 hour and 30 minutes total.**

Tennis Courts

Use of Heritage Hills Courts

A court reservation is forfeited when at least two players do not arrive within 10 minutes of their scheduled time. Any players currently on the court may stay on the court until the conclusion of the forfeited time slot.

Walk on play is allowed on any empty court for the duration of that time slot. Groups or individuals who have played earlier may continue to play on any court which is empty and IS NOT RESERVED.

Court time may be reserved for 1 player to play on Court 5 for practice purposes during non-prime time periods.


Violations of these rules will result in loss of tennis privileges based upon the seriousness of the offense. For example, for "double booking" a one month loss of tennis privileges will be imposed for the 1st offense and loss of season privileges for subsequent offenses.

Court Etiquette At Heritage Hills

- Food is prohibited on all courts.
- Only soft-soled tennis shoes are permitted.
- Changing clothes on the court is not allowed.
- Profanity or loud verbal exchanges are not allowed.
- While play is in progress do not enter the courts.
- Use the gate between court 1 and court 2 to access court 2.
- Keep gates closed after entering and departing the courts.
- Contact the reservation desk as soon as possible to cancel a court reservation.
 Other players may want your time slot.
- Report all maintenance issues to Society Office promptly. Call (914-276-2908)





Fitness Center Rules

The following rules were designed to protect the substantial investment residents made in our Fitness Center and to enhance their enjoyment and experience. We wish to provide an atmosphere in which each user of our Fitness Center will be respectful and considerate of others, and take personal responsibility for the care and preservation of our facility and its equipment as if it were his or her own valued possessions.

The success of our Fitness Center depends on the cooperation, courtesy and respect of all our residents.

Society reserves the right to adjust, modify, or change any of these rules at any time.

Security

- 1. Every resident is required to scan their picture ID card before entering the Fitness Center. If their ID is lost, there will be a \$25.00 fee for a replacement ID.
- 2. Every resident's ID is required to be visible while working out.
- 3. Camera surveillance will be monitoring the facility at all times.
- 4. Heritage Hills Society will not be responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged personal items.
- 5. Inappropriate behavior will not be tolerated, including reluctance to follow the Rules and Regulations.

Security will be called if you or your guest disregards rules. Your privileges will be suspended.

Guests

- 1. During the hours of 8am-8pm, each resident will be allowed up to 2 guests.
- 2. Resident's guests MUST sign in at the Security Office and provide one form of identification.
- 3. The same guest will not be allowed to use the Fitness Center more than three times in one month.

The resident must remain in the Fitness Center with their guest throughout the entire workout period. **Children**

- 1. No one under 14 years of age will be permitted into the Fitness Center under any circumstances.
- 2. Residents between the ages of 14 and 16 may use the Fitness Center while accompanied by a resident adult and are required to sign in at the Security Desk to obtain a pass.

Residents 16 years of age and older are admitted without an adult provided they have their own ID.

Equipment

- 1. Cardio workouts are strictly limited to 30 minutes if there are other residents waiting.
- 2. Weights are restricted to free weight area only.
- 3. All dumbbells and free weights are to be returned to rack upon completion of your workout.
- 4. Exercise mats are to remain in assigned areas only.

Use provided paper towel and solution to clean equipment, stretch tables and mats after use.

Locker Room

- 1. Provide your own lock for locker.
- 2. Locks must be removed upon exiting the facility. Locks will clipped if found overnight and contents discarded.

Instructors & Monitors

- 1. Our in-house Certified Staff is available to provide instruction to residents on how to use the equipment or set up a workout program for you on a one-time basis. Please seethe staff for an appointment. Workout cards are available in front of the Fitness Center Office.
- 2. No Personal Trainers, other than Fitness Center employees, are allowed to train residents in the center.

Private training can be arranged with the Fitness Center staff members outside of their working hours.

Boxing Equipment

You can use the boxing equipment only if you bring your own personal gloves. You cannot be barehanded.

A full list of rules and regulations are available in the fitness center or security office.

Shuttles Bus Rules & Regulations

- 1. The Heritage Hills shuttle service operates as follows: Pick-ups and drop-offs are Lake Lodge, Activities Center, 202 Plaza, Bailey Court, Elephant Hotel (Town Hall), Somers Town Plaza (CVS), Somers Professional Commons, Millpond Office Complex, Goldens Bridge Acme and Goldens Bridge Metro North Station. Only Heritage Hills residents in good standing and having a Heritage Hills ID tag may ride the shuttle. A Heritage Hills ID must be shown to the shuttle driver upon request.
- 2. The shuttle operates at specific times between the Activities Center parking area, Lake Lodge, East and West Hill pick-up stops (units on "B" roads and intersection of "C" roads at a "A" or "B" road) and drop off points when returning to Heritage Hills.
- 3. The shuttle isn't a taxi service and will only pick-up discharge residents at the designate times and locations. Priority is always given to riders going to the train station.
- 4. Reservations for the following day may only be made after 4:00 PM or must be made at least one hour prior to the pick-up time. Commuters may request placement on a permanent reservations list for pick-up each day at the same time and place.
- 5. All passengers must be at their pick-up point five (5) minutes prior to the scheduled pick-up time. Passengers must call Security if they decide to cancel their pick-up; repetitive no shows will result in loss of ridership.
- 6. Shuttles will move only when all passengers are seated and seat belts are fastened.
- 7. Shuttle drivers are instructed not to pick-up any unscheduled persons.
- 8. The drivers may not leave their seats with passengers on board and the engine running, except in the event of an emergency when Security has been notified.
- 9. The drivers are responsible for reporting any improper incident to Security resulting in a formal report is filed.
- 10. The drivers are required to report to Security the name and unit number of any passenger who is abusive, disruptive or compromises the safety of the driver, fellow passengers or equipment. Service to these riders will be suspended from ridership and can only be reinstated by the Society Board upon the recommendation of the Transportation Committee following an investigation and a hearing.
- 11. No smoking, eating or drinking is allowed onboard the shuttle. Cell phone use is discouraged except in emergency situations.
- 12. Animals: Only service animals are permitted on the shuttles. Small pets of any kind sitting on a lap or in a carrier are not allowed on the Society shuttle.
- 13. Bicycles, shopping carts or any apparatus of any kind is NOT allowed on the Society shuttle.

Woodworking Rules & Regulations

Shop Rules and Regulations

The Heritage Hills Woodcraft Club is part of the Heritage Hills Society. As such, it is one of the facilities available to all residents. The Society maintains its exteriors, pays for heating and electricity, and provides some interior services. The Club, in turn, is responsible for the operation and maintenance of its portion of the shop and its contents. The Club equipment has either been donated to the Club or bought by the Club and is the property of the Society. The Club owns no property or equipment. The Club is organized and run according to terms specified in its Constitution and By-laws, which are available for inspection by any member upon request.

Membership

Only Heritage Hills residents are permitted to join the Woodcraft Club.

New members must complete an application form, sign a waiver, and obtain a copy of the Shop Rules and Regulations.

Annual dues are set by the Board of Directors. Dues are collected in June of each year.

Attendance Procedures

An attendance book is kept on the monitor's desk at the front of the shop.

All members and guests who visit for more than a few minutes must sign in in ink, every time you enter the shop, and sign out when leaving, with first and last names written in a legible and readable manner.

Monitors

A monitor is on duty whenever the shop is opened. The monitor has the absolute authority to ensure that all tools and machines are used safely, and that members behave in a manner that does not jeopardize the safety of themselves or other members.

Tools and Clean-up

The shop is equipped with a collection of hand and power tools. These tools, and many related items, are located in the tool crib, which is opened whenever the shop is opened. When these tools are used they should be returned to their proper place. No tools should leave the shop at any time.

If a tool is broken or damaged while in use, report it to the shop monitor, who in turn will report it to the Board of Directors. Similarly, if a needed item (for example, glue) appears to be in short supply, report it to the shop monitor.

Each member must clean up, leaving the area in good order for the next member. The shop has no full -time janitor and depends on every member to keep it in good order through mutual cooperation. When you leave the shop, the workbenches and machines should be cleaned and cleared for the next person. Members are requested to put work, either in progress or finished, in the crib in the designated spaces — both for safety's sake and so that it is not in the way of members working in the shop. Prohibitions Spray painting is prohibited in the shop. No pressure treated wood impregnated with toxic materials, such as CCA pressure-treated wood or lead painted wood, may be worked in the shop. Guests are not permitted to use the shop facility or to engage in any work activity while in the shop. Minors (whether residents of Heritage Hills or not) are not allowed in the shop at any time for safety and insurance reasons.

The Woodcraft Club is a hobby club. The Board retains the right to make a determination as to whether a member is making unreasonable use of the shop and equipment for personal gain.

The Heritage Hills Library is open to all Heritage Hills Residents at no charge.

A Board of Managers, consisting of seven Heritage Hills Residents, operates the library. The library is open Monday thru Friday from 10:00am to 3:00pm and Saturday from 10:30am to 1:30pm. During those time periods the Library has dedicated volunteers to assist those who would like to borrow books or need information related to the Library.

The Library has more than 1800 books with 10 to 12 new books purchased every month and also 10 to 12 older books, acquired mostly through donations, added every month. Books genres include fiction, mystery, non-fiction, biography and classics. We also have over 100 large print books. These books are listed on this web site, appear in the Heritage Hills Newsletter, are sent out in e-mail blasts and appear on bulletin boards just outside of the library. Almost all of these books can be borrowed by Heritage Hills Residents for a two week period at no charge.

The library also has 16 magazines that it subscribes to and are available to residents to read in the library. In addition, the library has its own Scrabble Club within the library, and it also has Jigsaw puzzles and games for the residents. There is a lovely electric fireplace that is used in the winter and comfortable chairs to read in. There are numerous electric outlets in the library for residents to charge their electronic devices such as laptop computers, smart phones, etc. We also encourage residents to use their laptops in the library.

Every Wednesday evening Heritage Hills Library Cinema shows classic films on its 55 inch flat screen television. The film schedule is posted in the activities center and the names of upcoming films are also posted on a bulletin board located just outside of the library and sent out in e-mail blasts every week and appear in the Heritage Hills Newsletter every month.

Security profiles are important to your safety and security when you choose to live at Heritage Hills of Westchester.

We urge you to complete the form on the back of this message as soon as you are able to do so, and to bring it, along with a set of keys for your unit (optional - but secure and to your benefit), to the Security Office, located at 8 Heritage Hills Drive. The office is in front of the fitness center.

The information you provide in the completion of the form will assist us in knowing who you are; how many live in your unit (including pets) if there is an emergency; who to reach in your absence; and to whom (if anyone) you pre-approve the privilege of entering your unit when you are not present - which may include family, contractors, etc. The information will be entered into Security's private data base.

Please answer the questions on the form as completely as you can. If you have any special medical equipment in your unit, that is very important information.

You are encouraged to update the form when anything may change, such as who resides at the unit, phone number changes, medical conditions which should be noted, etc.

There are also Security forms you can complete if you will be away from your unit for a prolonged period, so that Security will increase patrols around your unit if possible during your absence.

If you ever have the need to make a 911 call from your Heritage phones, that call is answered by our Security team. They are your first responders,
